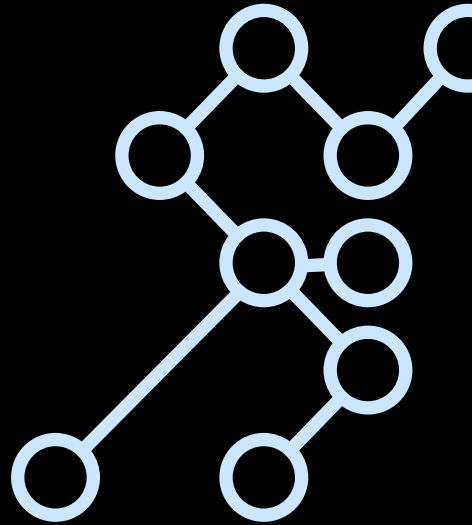

A two day course covering the classification, assessment and surgical management of peri-prosthetic fractures around hip and knee replacements. The course is designed for senior trainees (ST6+) and post-FRCS orthopaedic surgeons. Participants will have the opportunity to use modern fixation, revision systems and endoprostheses. They will also have the chance for in depth discussions on difficult cases with an expert panel.

By the end of the course, participants should have a comprehensive framework for decision making around peri-prosthetic fracture management and some useful practical tips and tricks for both fixation and revision.

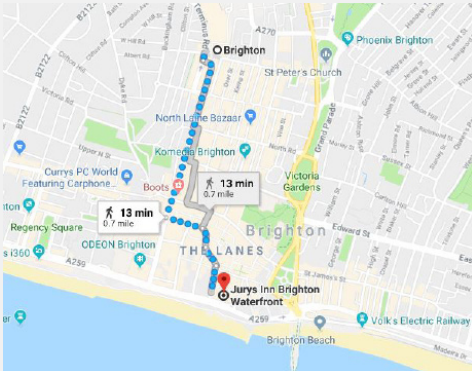
