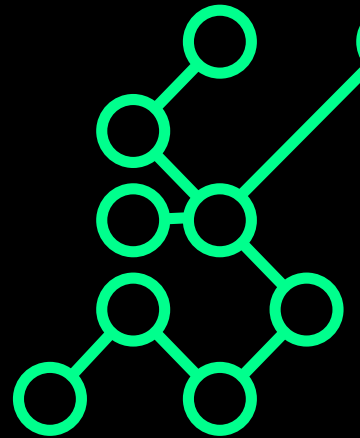

Faculty biographies (where supplied)

Mr Suroosh Madanipour

Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon, St George's University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust

Mr Suroosh Madanipour is a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at St George's University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust in London and the South West London Elective Orthopaedic Centre in Epsom. He specialises in hip and knee replacements, with particular expertise in managing painful or failing joint replacements in a highly specialised tertiary centre.

Mr Madanipour obtained his medical degrees from the University of Cambridge and University College London before completing specialist orthopaedic training at the Royal London Hospital. He then pursued advanced subspecialty training through the world-renowned hip and knee reconstruction fellowship in Vancouver, Canada. Prior to his appointment at St George's, he worked as a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital in Stanmore, further developing his expertise in complex hip and knee reconstruction.

His research focuses on advanced techniques and outcomes in complex hip and knee replacement surgery. His work has been widely published in leading medical journals and presented at international conferences.

Mr John Stammers

Consultant Orthopaedic surgeon, Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital NHS Trust

Following five years as a Consultant at St George's Hospital and the South West London Elective Orthopaedic Centre, Mr John Stammers was appointed as a complex hip, knee and revision surgeon at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital. He performs high volume complex primary and revisions with a special interest in the investigation of painful joint replacements and manages patients with infected and failed joint replacements.

He completed his surgical apprenticeship in world-class institutions performing high-volume hip and knee replacements. His exposure to complex arthroplasty included rotations at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital, the Royal London and Guy's and St Thomas' hospitals. He refined his subspecialised training completing two arthroplasty fellowships: The Barts Elective Orthopaedic Hospital and became the first UK trainee to complete one of the most sought-after operative fellowships in America at the Rothman Institute, Thomas Jefferson University Hospital, Philadelphia. This enabled John to operate alongside some world-famous leaders in orthopaedic surgery, performing high volume hip and knee surgeries using the latest technologies and techniques.

Mr Stammers graduated medical school at University College London, has a research degree in orthopaedics and was trained on the Royal London rotation. He is interested in clinical research, implant design, developing surgical leaders and training surgeons of the future.

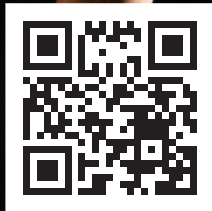
