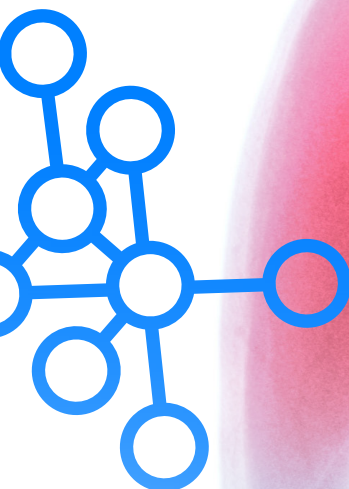

Nearest Tube: Library Metro Stop (Centenary Square): Located only a 2 to 5-minute walk from Austin Court.
